# Journeying together through Lent

... so the next generation might know ...

Key Biblical events are marked by the church calendar. During Lent and Easter we remember Christ's life, teaching, death, and resurrection. Faith Building Activities built around at this time of year provide a wonderful way to strengthen our faith and encourage the next generation to know God for themselves. Here are some ideas!

### Lenten Faith Building Activities

#### Faith Conversations

• Meet regularly with a friend or family member during Lent to share what God has been teaching you.

#### Devotions and Prayer

- Beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing on each Sunday leading up to Easter, read the Scripture passages provided. Use Scriptures that have been highlighted with small children.
- Memorize the Lord's Prayer with your children. Pray it together regularly during Lent.
- Learning a new Spiritual Discipline

Start a **Journal** to record your spiritual development. Write or draw your prayer requests and answers, record what God is saying to you or praise God in poetry. Adults <u>and</u> kids can benefit from this discipline.

#### Service

- Talk with your family about eating **one simple meal each week** of Lent and giving the money you save to your local Food Bank.
- Together with your family, spend time **serving others** during Lent. Work at a soup kitchen or homeless shelter. Visit elderly people who are in nursing homes or are shut-ins.

#### Rituals and Traditions

- Set up a **prayer table** at home. Gather here for times of prayer and Bible reading during Lent. Prayer table ideas: purple cloth, Bible, white candle, crown of thorns, empty cross, etc.
- Attend special Easter Week services at your church.

#### Eating together

• Celebrate **Pancake Tuesday** the day before Ash Wednesday with a pancake meal. Talk as a family about the fact that Pancake or Shrove Tuesday is meant to be a day that reminds us we are entering a season of confession and repentance.



## LENT

Lent is the Christian season of preparation before Easter. In Western Christianity, Ash Wednesday marks the first day, or the start of the season of Lent, which begins 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count).

Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline.

The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ – his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial and resurrection.
